#### EXERCISE FOR PEOPLE OVER 50

Begin by standing on a comfortable surface, where you have plenty of room at each side.

With a 5-lb potato bag in each hand, extend your arms straight out from your sides and hold them there as long as you can. Try to reach a full minute, and then relax.

Each day you'll find that you can hold this position for just a bit longer.

After a couple of weeks, move up to 10-lb potato bags.

Then try 50-lb potato bags and then eventually try to get to where you can lift a 100-lb potato bag in each hand and hold your arms straight for more than a full minute. (I'm at this level.)

After you feel confident at that level, put a potato in each bag.

On April 24th though the 28th, I had the opportunity to attend the 2010 California Grand Sessions for York Rite Masonry held in Bakersfield, California. For those who don't know, York Rite Freemasonry consists of three bodies, the Chapter, Council, & Commandery. Membership is open to all Freemasons and the experience will enhance the knowledge and understanding of Masonry in a variety of different rituals and historical lectures. The Grand Sessions consisted of Public Opening, Formal Opening, and installation of officers for each body and were well attended with visitors from California, other states, and countries. Excellent meals and lodging were provided for these sessions at a nominal price. A Golf Tournament, Commandery Drill Competition, and Special Award or Degree actitivities were also held. Another concordant body, the Allied Masonic Degrees also attended for an "In-Gathering". At that session a special Degree, The Master of Tyre; was awarded to eligible brethren. This Degree was performed in full costume and script by the Bakersfield, Western Council # 41 and presented a historical representation of the events surrounding the death of the grand master and workmen in the quarry which are not presented in the blue lodge ritual. The USS Potomac was built in 1934 as the Coast Guard cutter Electra. It was commissioned as a U.S. Navy vessel in 1936, renamed the USS Potomac, and served as Franklin Delano Roosevelt's Presidential Yacht and "Floating White House," until his death in 1945.
