

Sanchez, Senior Warden Louis J. Montero, and Junior Warden Jesse Solis-Jacques. This will be another amazing year of fellowship and brotherly love. We have the opportunity to continue to set the example of the beauty that lies within goodness and kindness for all mankind and creation itself.

As we begin a New Year, some of us may create "New Year's Resolutions." To ensure success of achieving your resolutions, choose reachable, realistic goals. "Daily Resolutions" may seem more appropriate for some of us. This creates a mindset that we can feel productive and fulfill a sense of purpose by the end of the day. Two daily habits or resolutions we can practice are the following theme by Worshipful Sanchez:

By Order of the Master, the 2017 theme is **SINCERITY AND PLAIN DEALING**, which describes the importance of **TRUTH** and integrity. The breath and beginning that gives life to relationships; thus, Truth is the foundation of every virtue. The first lesson we are taught in Masonry is to be good and true to ourselves and each other. As we contemplate on this virtue, it is essential to strive to improve and regulate our conduct. This will prove to the world that hypocrisy and deceit are unknown among masons and it is not part of our being. Worshipful Sanchez provided a mantra that we should follow: "Roman Words (Latin): VOX VERITAS VITA, meaning "Voice Truth Life" (Speak the TRUTH as a Way of Life.)."

**SINCERITY AND PLAIN DEALING** describes that we must be fair and honorable to one another in all occasions, especially when expressing our own opinions. This practice distinguishes us from all others. When in doubt, ask yourself this question: "Should a person trust my heart when my tongue is bitter?" Our hearts and tongues must be in alignment with our intentions. This practice allows us to "...join in promoting each other's welfare and rejoicing in each other's prosperity."

Although living a virtuous life of Truth, Sincerity and Plain Dealing may be a weakness for some of us and we may feel like a failure as a good person and a brother-- please remember that it is not your weaknesses or failures that determine who you are as a leader, individual, citizen, person, or even as a brother....it is how you respond to your weaknesses and failures that make you Great!

Keep practicing and adopting TRUTH, SINCERITY and PLAIN DEALING as a Way of Life. It's a beautiful thing! Be True...Be Honest...Be Kind.
