I would like to welcome our new Entered Apprentice Brothers Mauro Lara and Martin Buff.



Emblems of Innocence and Honor:

### The Masonic Apron

The Masonic apron is arguably one of the most recognizable of Masonic symbols. Revered as an emblem of innocence and honor, its evolution has been long and varied: from rough swaths of leath-ered hides to protect the clothing to richly decorated works of ceremonial folk art. The tradition of decorated aprons began around the 1730s - adorned both by professional engravers and embroiders, and by family members such as daughters and wives. After 1760, printed and engraved aprons became vogue and displayed popular Speculative symbols such as the all-seeing eye, the square and com-passes, and columns. In the United States, lecturers of Masonic ritual such as Jeremy Ladd Cross, or scholar/artists like Giles Fonda Yates, were to have a lasting and profound impact upon future genera-tions with their visual codification and depiction of Masonic symbols as represented by the Preston-Webb work or American (York) Rite. Following the American Civil War, a massive popularity with fraternal organizations gave rise to a very lucrative industry in the manufacture and sale of Masonic and fraternal regalia.


