Masonic Information Night

March 29, 2011

Have a friend, neighbor, or family member interested in masonry? The Sacramento Scottish Rite in conjunction with the Greater Sacramento Area Masonic Service Bureau is hosting a Masonic Information Night on March 29, 2011. Bring your family and friends that are interested in learning a little more about Freemasonry and its roots. Doors open at 6:00 PM and the program begins at 6:30 PM.

Worshipful Adam Kendal, P.M. will be speaking on **Balancing Faith and Reason, the Spirit of Freemasonry in the 18th-21st centuries.** This presentation will contextualize Freemasonry's origins and purpose in the 18th century and how it influenced the philosophers and statesmen that advocated freedom of thought and religion in England, France and the Americas. The lecture will also briefly explore important events in American Freemasonry's evolution through the 19th century that helped define how it is perceived by modern members and the public alike.

Light refreshments will be served after the presentation and those in attendance will have an opportunity to ask Brother Kendall questions. Many of the local Lodges will have tables and brethren present to answer questions about specific Lodge activities, fees for degrees, and general membership requirements.
